**CRM Archaeological Field School
Offered by the Department of Anthropology**

The Experience: The class will focus on professional archaeological field methods, Cultural Resource Management (CRM), and historic interpretations of modern landscapes. Course work will include comprehensive analysis of artifacts, systematic pedestrian survey, controlled excavation, and mapping with GPS and Total Station technology. Introductory training will also be provided in remote sensing technologies.

Places and Projects: Several project areas with unique cultural, archaeological, and historic significance will be investigated. Dates for each type of site investigation are tentative. Transportation is provided. Housing is available through CWU, or will include field camps at more remote locations.

--June 20-July 4: Archaeological site record updating, total station and GPS site mapping, Middle Columbia River. Emphasis on in-field artifact classification, coding, and data processing (lithics and fauna).

--July 4-July 20: Ethnographic village site mapping, Yakima Basin. Focus on tribal consultation and coordination.

--July 20-August 10: CWU Campus historic archaeology focus on remote sensing and controlled excavation.

--August 10- August 22: Participants will have the option of working in remote field locations including: Hells Canyon, Lower Columbia and/or Okanogan Country.
