

Master of Education—Reading Specialist

The MEd-Reading Specialist Program at CWU is designed to provide classroom teachers with in-depth knowledge and skills in the teaching of reading. With continuous enrollment, the candidate can complete the program in approximately two years.

This program offers a unique combination of face-to-face courses and distance education. This hybrid offers the candidate to complete the courses without have to travel a great distance. The bulk of the reading courses are offered in alternate summers through distance education from Ellensburg to the Des Moines, Yakima, and Wenatchee Centers. The remainder of the courses is offered on campus and at the various university centers during the academic year.
